Since it is very difficult to get 6 Foreign and 6 Indian Examiners, the Examination Reforms Committee members approved to reduce the number of panel examiners 4 instead of 6 members and also newly introduced 3 recent research publications (articles in indexed and refereed journals) (within 7 years) for each experts have to be submitted along with the panel of examiners for the Ph.D thesis valuation. The same was implemented with effect from 01.07.2022 and onwards.

2. Implementation of moderation level as per UGC regulations was ratified.

As per UGC regulations, moderation may be applied in case of large number of fail grades or high grades, or when large numbers of students who have received the same grade or clustering of students on letter grades, or when there are discrepancies between grades allocated to individual students in different courses, or to find out the difficulty level of the question paper or whether the assessments modes used cover the entire syllabus or not. Based on UGC guidelines **moderation levels had been applied from the even semester examination of 2021 – 2022 and onwards.** Based on the question paper feedback received from the students and subject handling teachers and large number of failures (more than 60%), subject-wise moderation was applied.

3. Conducting In-house examination for the Engineering students who have not completed NPTEL Courses was ratified.

Considering the Student's higher studies and career opportunities it was decided to conduct the In-house examination for the B.E Students of 2018 batch and M.E Students of 2020 batch (total: 23 students) in June 2022 for the NPTEL course in which students have enrolled.

4. **For the Part IV Components** (Ability Enhancement, Co-curricular, Value Added Courses, Professional certification, MOOC courses and Audit courses) presently two different range of marks are followed in the consolidated mark sheet, which leads to confusion in mark entry and calculation. Hence applying common range of marks for all Part IV Components applicable for students admitted from the academic year 2022-2023 and onwards was approved.

Dr.K.S.Pushpa enquired on the setting up of question papers & evaluation. The Controller of Examinations i.c. explained the same.

The Research Advisory Committee members unanimously decided on extending the existing biometric system to Ph.D. scholars too. This was implemented from June 2022.

Charging of discontinuation fee

- It was resolved to recommend framing norms for refunding the amount to the scholar in case of discontinuation from the programme. The details have to be incorporated in the Prospectus.
- If the scholar has not attended classes, Rs.1000 of the paid fees to be deducted
- If the scholar has attended classes less than or equal to 15 days, 50% of the paid fees will be refunded
- If the scholar has attended classes more than a month, caution deposit alone will be refunded.

- **Maternity leave**

UGC notification D.O. No. 2L-LL61202L (CPP-II) dtd.14.12.2021 - Maternity leave sanctioned from 180 to 240 days. One scholar SakthiSaranya has availed 3 year leave and claims for two maternity leave. As per UGC regulation only one maternity leave can be sanctioned during the entire period of Ph.D programme. She is granted one maternity leave and the rest of the period is considered as absent.

- Part-time scholars henceforth need to submit a copy of service certificate along with their Doctoral committee request Proforma.
- The journal publications included in the coverage period of UGC CARE group I and II journals will be considered only for thesis submission
- **Nomenclature of Directorate of Research and Development changed to Research and Development Cell as per UGC circular**

As per UGC circular dt. 8.6.2022 Ref:1-5(2021(NEP/Desk-parl.)) the nomenclature of Directorate of Research and Development is changed to Research and Development Cell and Dean R&D as Director R&D.

- As per Deans and HoDs meet on 10th June 2022, one Doctoral Committee member will be selected by the Vice Chancellor from the panel of 4 subject experts.
- It was resolved to consider the guideship requests of regular faculty if they have good publications over and above the Ph.D requirement of publications.

- It was unanimously resolved to call for an emergency Doctoral Committee meeting for the request placed by Dr.Kasthuri, Professor of Extension Education to transfer two scholars owing to health issues.
