Following are the points to be considered related to the publications under Ph.D. or funded projects in this Institute:

- An author is generally considered to be an individual who has made significant contribution to the study.
- Authors should have major contribution to the conception and design; analysis and interpretation; draft or revise; agree to the accountability; and approval of the final version of the paper.
- As per International Committee for Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) , authors 'should be able to identify which co-authors are responsible for specific other parts of the work and have confidence in the integrity of the contributions of their co-authors'
- Authors and order of authors should be 'a joint decision of all the authors '.
- From UGC SHODHGANGA publications, it is understood that UGC accepts publications with authors from different criteria like Scholars, Project Fellows, Guide, Co-Guide, other outside experts of the same/other fields despite the order of the names.
- Few reputed journals have their own authorship guidelines which need to be followed during the submission of the articles.
- To reduce the incidence of authorship disputes, proper listing and acknowledgement criteria have to be agreed between the authors like declaration of 'Author contributions, Author's conflict of interest, Author's competing interest' in the articles, if permitted by the editors of the respective journals/proceedings.

Even in the publications of MPhil and PhD research work, the Supervisor and the scholar have the right to include the name of any subject expert in their field, if they have contributed to the work through knowledge sharing.

3. Plagiarism rules as per UGC norms

The Notification of University Grants Commission (Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism Higher Educational Institutions Regulations, 2018 New Delhi dated 23rd July, 2018 No. F. 1-18/2010(CPP-II) has been recommended for implementation while submitting M.Phil. and Ph.D. dissertation according to which plagiarism would be quantified into the following levels in ascending order of severity for the purpose of its definition:

Level 0: Similarities upto 10% - Minor similarities, no penalty

Level 1: Similarities above 10% to 40%

Level 2: Similarities above 40% to 60%

Level 3: Similarities above 60%

This Institution has already introduced the Security Features and other aspects in the Degree Certificates and mark sheets. Permission is requested to incorporate the mode of delivery (regular/part time) of the programme in the certificates from the academic year 2019-2020 & onwards.

b. Details on MOOCs Courses offered through SWAYAM Platform

UGC through its letter F.No. 1-8/2017 (SWAYAM Board) dated 19th June, 2019 informed the following:
