- $N \rightarrow No$ visits to unwanted websites
- $E \rightarrow$ Educate against using fake schemes
- Furthermore, U signifies the responsibility of the youth that is, each individual must always be vigilant and take precautions against cyber threats.

- Nearly 90 students meticulously attended the awareness program and benefited from it.



- Students were alerted to common tactics used by cybercriminals, such as showering compliments and gifts in a short span.
- They were educated on the potentially manipulative nature of such interactions and encouraged to be cautious and vigilant.
- In cases involving cyberbullying, harassment, or other malicious activities, the program emphasized the importance of collecting and preserving posts and messages as evidence.

- The second session, scheduled between 11:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m., featured real-time examples led by Dr.Vijayabhanu.
- This was followed by a feedback session and a quiz program on cyber security and safety to reinforce the insights gained.
