Arockia Maraichelvi** and the NEP SAARTHI Coordinator and Viksit Bharat team member **Dr. Mutum Silpa Devi**, along with the NEP SAARTHIs, conducted a panel discussion on "*Relevance of Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) in Building Viksit Bharat 2047.*" The event was organised in collaboration with the Viksit Bharat Team led by **Dr. R. Radha**, Associate Professor, Department of Food Service Management & Dietetics, Nodal Officer, Viksit Bharat, along with team members **Dr. Indira E.** and **Dr. Lincy P.**

The session commenced with an invocation, followed by a warm welcome address by **Dr. K. Arockia Maraichelvi**, Professor, Department of Human Development and Coordinator, NEP Cell. **Dr. R. Radha**, Associate Professor, Department of Food Service Management & Dietetics and Nodal Officer, Viksit Bharat, introduced the esteemed panelists. The panel discussion was moderated by **Dr. Indira E.**







Highlights of the Panel Discussion:

Dr. **Aramya A.R.** highlighted Ayurveda's enduring contribution to India's civilizational knowledge, emphasizing the importance of purifying medicinal ingredients to ensure their therapeutic effectiveness. She also stressed the need to revive rare or nearly extinct medicinal plant species and underscored how restoring indigenous botanical resources can significantly enhance the accessibility and affordability of healthcare.

Dr. **G. Sivasubramaniam** discussed the scientific dimensions of Indian Knowledge Systems, tracing their evolution from ancient traditions to contemporary applications. He shared insights from his research on the UV-protective properties of cow dung, reinforcing its scientific relevance. Further, he emphasized the importance of sustainability and the ability to

differentiate myths and superstitions from scientific truths, highlighting how belief systems play a role in preserving and meaningfully applying traditional knowledge.

Dr. V. T. Bindu focused on the vital role of tourism as a pathway to understanding IKS. She explained how tourism facilitates the transmission of cultural knowledge and enriches students' learning through experiential exposure. By engaging with heritage sites and cultural practices firsthand, students can deepen their appreciation and understanding of India's traditional knowledge systems.

Dr. S. Gurugnanambiga spoke eloquently in Tamil, drawing from Tamil classical literature to illustrate the educational philosophies deeply rooted in the Tamil tradition. She highlighted the profound pedagogical and philosophical insights embedded in classical Tamil texts, demonstrating how they continue to influence and inform contemporary approaches to learning and cultural understanding.





Closing:

The moderator, **Dr. Indira E.**, presented a concise summary of the insights shared by all panelists.

The session concluded with a heartfelt Vote of Thanks delivered by **Dr. Mutum Silpa Devi**, Assistant Professor, Department of Human Development and Coordinator, NEP SAARTHI.



Objectives of the Group Discussion:

The Group Discussion was organised to provide a platform for students to critically examine the reforms introduced under the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and explore how these reforms can contribute to India's vision of *Viksit Bharat 2047*. The session aimed to:

- Encourage students to reflect on structural, curricular, and pedagogical shifts proposed in NEP 2020.
- Facilitate informed discussion on how NEP-driven reforms can transform higher education, skill development, and employability.
- Enable students to connect educational reforms with national development goals in an interactive academic setting.
- Promote collaborative thinking, analytical reasoning, and participatory learning.

Overview of the Event:

The session was coordinated by Ms. Raksheni Shamyuqktha, NEP SAARTHI, who moderated the discussion and ensured active participation from all members. Guidance for the session was provided by Dr. Indira E. (Assistant Professor, Department of Visual Communication), Dr. Mutum Silpa Devi (Assistant Professor, Department of Human Development & Coordinator, NEP SAARTHI), and Dr. Lincy P. (Assistant Professor, Department of Food Service Management & Dietetics), all of whom are members of the Viksit Bharat team.

Summary of the Discussion:

The Group Discussion began with participants sharing their understanding of NEP 2020 and its vision for restructuring the Indian education system. Students reflected on key reforms such as flexible curricular structures, multidisciplinary education, holistic development, and competency-based learning.

A significant part of the discussion focused on how NEP 2020 promotes student autonomy, allowing learners to choose courses across disciplines, thereby fostering creativity and personal growth. Participants appreciated the introduction of the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) and the Multiple Entry–Exit System, recognizing their potential to increase academic mobility and reduce dropout rates.

The role of NEP 2020 in creating a skill-driven education system was discussed extensively. Students highlighted the importance of integrating internships, field projects, and experiential learning into academic programmes to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical application.

Another major theme was the alignment of NEP 2020 with India's goal of becoming a developed nation by 2047. Participants noted that reforms focusing on digital learning, teacher training, vocational education, and promotion of Indian languages contribute directly to nation-building. They emphasized that combining global competencies with India's cultural strengths will create a future-ready, confident generation.

The discussion also allowed participants to reflect critically on the challenges associated with the policy, such as infrastructure needs, phased implementation, teacher preparedness, and equitable opportunities. Students suggested that consistent monitoring, collaboration between institutions, and adequate resource allocation are essential for successful execution.

Conclusion

The Group Discussion concluded with a shared understanding that NEP 2020 is a forward-looking and transformative framework that aims to strengthen India's education system and accelerate progress towards *Viksit Bharat 2047*. Participants agreed that while the policy has immense potential, its success depends on systematic, inclusive, and phased implementation.

The session encouraged critical thinking, collaborative dialogue, and deeper comprehension of national educational priorities. It provided a meaningful platform for students to connect policy frameworks with real-world implications and recognize their own role as active contributors to India's growth and development.
