The Ministry of Education had conveyed the approval of President of India, for Entrustment of Audit of Accounts of our Institute to the C&AG of India for a period of five years from 2021-22 to 2025-26 under Section 20(1) of C&AG 's (DPC) Act, 1971 vide its letter No.F.12-11/2021-U.3(A) dated 18.09.2023.

Accounts for the FY 2024-25 during the period 09.06.2025 to 18.06.2025 and sent their Draft Separate Audit Report (SAR) vide letter No. D.O.Lr.No.DGA (C)/CE/VIII/28-43/2025-26 dated 25.07.2025. We carried out necessary corrections based on the remarks pointed out by the C&AG in their Draft SAR. It has been instructed by the C&AG to obtain the approval of the competent authorities and to forward the copy of the minutes of the meeting to them within 14 days.

PART 4: ACTION PLAN FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND MONITORING OF THE MoU

- 4.1 Performance evaluation against these MoU parameters shall be carried out annually, on the Parameters given in Annexure, and monitored by the Ministry of Education in consultation with the Commission.
- 4.2 The performance evaluation so carried out shall be submitted to the Executive Council (EC) of the Deemed to be University during the EC meetings for consideration. After the EC meeting, the same shall be sent to Commission along with its recommendations.
- 4.3 A joint review shall be carried out within 180 days of completion of the Financial Year by the Deemed to be University, UGC and Ministry of Education. The result of the joint review, as declared by the Ministry of Education, shall be placed before the EC and hosted prominently on the website of the Deemed to be University.

PART 5: REQUIREMENT FROM THE UGC AND MINISTRY OF EDUCATION

The deemed to be University shall submit detailed proposal along with detailed justifications to UGC/Ministry of Education, duly approved and recommended by its Finance Committee/ Executive Council. UGC/ Ministry of Education may consider release of funds as per given justifications. Besides, UGC/ Ministry of Education will also provide administrative support and permissions wherever required as per the provisions of the existing UGC Regulations.

Accordingly, the performance evaluation against the MoU parameters upto the month of March 2025 for the FY 2024-25 is placed as **Annexure. II** (a) before the Finance Committee for consideration and recommendations.

Note:

Aided:

The advertisement for the recruitment of 77 Teaching and 14 Non-Teaching Posts including regular and backlog vacancies under reservation category was published in 'The Hindu' dated 29.12.2021 and also uploaded in the UGC portal on 29.12.2021, adhering to the UGC regulations and reservation norms. The last date for the receipt of the applications was 28.01.2022. Thereafter, the UGC informed vide its Letter No: F.No.1-1/2013(DU) dated 10th June, 2022 that, in view of the spirit of the MoE's letter dated 29.05.2015, there was no justification for recommending the positions due to the financial implication to the UGC /MoE.

Regarding Statutory posts of Registrar, Finance Officer, Controller of Examinations and Assistant Controller of Examinations, an advertisement calling for applications was published on 12.04.2023 with the last date of submission as 11.05.2023. Due to unforeseen delays, the process of recruitment could not be completed within the stipulated period of six months. Subsequently, it has been unanimously resolved by the Executive Council, in its 131st meeting held on 22.11.2023, authorizing the Vice Chancellor to advertise the statutory posts and complete the process at the earliest. Accordingly, advertisements have been published for the posts of Finance Officer and Assistant Librarian in 'The Hindu' dated 27.03.2024.



Recommendation of the Finance Committee

Subject: Strategic Recommendation Based on Performance Evaluation (2024–25)

The Finance Committee has reviewed the Institute's performance across academic, administrative, research, financial, and outreach domains as per the MoU indicators. The committee appreciates the progress and achievements and recommends the following:

I. Academic Excellence & Admissions

- **Admissions** have shown consistent strength, including enrolment from other states (22.8%) and international students (0.4%).
- **Student–Teacher Ratio** has improved to 16:1, in line with national standards.

- The 141st meeting of Executive Council of the Institute held on 02.06.2025 has resolved to establish an Office of Endowments exclusively for the purpose of strengthening the existing endowments, create new endowments and mobilize corpus fund by tapping resources from various stakeholders and the process is going on.

- Enhancement of UGC grants and extramural funding opportunities.
- Strategic investment in research, internationalization, and student support systems.

The Finance Committee congratulates the leadership and urges the Institute to sustain and enhance this performance in alignment with NEP 2020 and national priorities.
