The Academic Council meeting started with Prayer.

Welcome Address

Dr. (Mrs.)A.Vijayalakshmi, Dean (Academics) welcomed all the Academic Council members.

Vice Chancellor **Dr.(Mrs.)V.Bharathi Harishankar** highlighted the significant happenings in the last 6 months –

- NCTE approval for conducting Integrated Teacher Education Programme from 2026-27 (our institution is one of the two institutions in Tamilnadu to get this programme)
- RCI approval for conducting Integrated Special and Inclusive Teacher Education Programme from 2025-26
- AICTE Extension of approval for conducting all Engineering programmes, MBA, MCA, BCA & BBA programmes
- NBA Accrediation for the ECE department programmes
- NRI intake for all Engineering programmes
- RCI approval for BASLP programme
- Inauguration of activities of the Centre for Continuing Education by Shri. C.P.Radhakrishnan, Honourable Governor of Maharashtra
- Conduct of Green audit by third party and awarded as the best university.

Vice Chancellor Madam appreciated the IQAC team for their various activities and Entire Tamil department for receiving Mangala Sirpiyar award during the International Women's day. Vice Chancellor Madam mentioned the students' achievements such as 9 students of our Institution were approved as NEP SAARTHIs and 95% of outgoing Engineering students are in Paid Internship for one full semester.

Madam mentioned about the appointment of 10 Professors of Practice so far and expressed her sincere gratitude and deep condolences to one of the PoP Mr.Karappan, who passed away recently. Other achievements mentioned are, Dr.Caven McLoughlin, Professor, Emeritus of Psychology, Fulbright Senior Specialist, Kent State University, Ohio, USA along with a team of faculty from different disciplines of our Institution proposed to plan & publish a Multidisciplinary book on 'Care for the Elderly'.

For the current year the institution has 167 scopus publications, 111 Web of Science Publications, 14 patents (8 of them have been published & 5 have been granted), 11 copyrights have been filed, 102 MoUs are currently active & 23 on-going projects; 29 of our students completed the ISRO start programme which was conducted by the Institute of Remote Sensing.

Ph.D. scholar Ms.Haritha from Food Science and Nutrition has got the National Institute of Disaster Management's Doctoral Fellowship and at all India level Ms.Aruna P , Ms.Pon Nivetha and Ms.Harinivashini, research scholars mentored by Dr.P.Lalitha bagged the second prize(Rs.50000) in the International Anveshan event organized by the AIU at Chitkara University, Chandigarh in March 2025. Our Institution bagged the first prize in the southern zone in the research convention Anveshan organized by MS Ramaiah University, Bengaluru in Feb 2025.

Institution set a record for the largest Screen Printing of the Indian Flag done by the B.E. Printing Technology students and placed in the Kalam Book of Records – which is a National level event.

Revision of In-house Project guidelines

The in-house Project Guidelines were revised was approved. The revised guidelines are effective from 18.11.2024. For this academic year 2024-2025, 35 In – house Projects (Seed Money – 12 & Minor Research Projects – 23) totaling to a financial outlay of Rs.28,64,000/- was sanctioned to 57 faculty (35 PIs &22 Co-PIs).

RAC committee member list– The term of RAC existing members is renewed for a period of one year – upto January 2026.

Resolutions

- ✚ It was resolved to consider the requests of scholars for discontinuation from Ph.D. programme if it was based on health grounds. It was also suggested to consider counseling for the students, internally within the respective Schools.
- ✚ It was resolved to permit conditional condonation for research scholars who lack in attendance in subsequent two semesters in the case of FT scholars and two years in the case of PT scholars. RAC resolved to look into the progress of the scholar and permit another final condonation if there is progress and to get an undertaking that no further condonation would be permitted by RAC.
- ✚ It was resolved to send a communication to inactive scholars intimating their absenteeism and follow-up with the response. Each request from inactive scholars will be evaluated individually by the research committee, ensuring that decisions are tailored to the specific circumstances of each case. Decisions made for one candidate shall not be cited as precedent for future cases; each situation requires independent consideration and cannot be generalized. It will be clearly communicated that any concessions made in one case must be referred back to the research committee for review in subsequent cases.
- ✚ Dr. Mangala Sunder Krishnan proposed that in cases of absence due to medical leave, a panel of doctors may be constituted. Based on the recommendations of this medical board, the requests for medical leave from scholars may be evaluated. Approval for medical leave may be granted in accordance with the board's recommendations, ensuring that each case is considered individually. **It was resolved** to create a panel of approved medical professionals for conducting health assessments for students, ensuring consistency and reliability in evaluations.

- ✚ To ensure transparency and provide a record of support offered to candidates, which can be referenced by the department, supervisors, and deans it was resolved to formalize the mentoring process by documenting counseling sessions with candidates, especially those facing personal challenges.

In the Boards of Studies held on 06.03.2025, the boards **have identified the Industries for implementation of Apprenticeship** from the NATS Portal. Further the Chairpersons can identify 1 or 2 industries **to have an MoU with the Industries** to initiate the Introduction of an **Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Programme**. An Apprenticeship can be implemented / incorporated into the curriculum during their final semester and all the Undergraduate degree Programmes offered by the Higher Educational Institutions are eligible to embed apprenticeship into the degree Programme.

The UGC Guidelines for implementing Apprenticeship Embedded Degree Programme (AEDP) is detailed in **Annexure 45.1**

b) UGC letter F.O.2-3/2022(QIP) dated 25th March 2025 on Guidelines for Implementation of Recognition of Prior Learning in Higher Education

The National Credit Framework (NCrF) promotes broad-based, multidisciplinary and holistic education by assigning credits to all types of learning. This includes integrating credits from academic domains and experiential learning, such as internships, apprenticeships, on-the-job training, and work experience. RPL has become a transformative tool for higher education. RPL has the potential to unlock the abilities of individuals who have gained knowledge and skills through diverse avenues beyond traditional classrooms, paving the way for educational advancement and personal growth.

RPL recognize all types of learning, including formal education, workplace training, experiential learning, self-study and community-based learning. This ensures that students' varied experiences and skills are acknowledged and valued.

The detailed Guidelines and Action Plan suggested for Implementation of RPL in Higher Education is given in **Annexure 45.2**

c) UGC's letter D.O.No.F.159854/UGC/IKS/2025 dated 26th March 2025 on Incorporation of Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS) in Higher Education Curricula.

Incorporation of Indian Knowledge System is one of the initiative under NEP 2020. As part of this initiative, specialized IKS Research Centers and IKS Teacher Training Centers have been established to drive research, curriculum development and faculty training.

Collaboration with these centers can ensure a structured and effective integration of IKS into UG and PG programs. Incorporating IKS enriches academic disciplines, fosters interdisciplinary learning, and connects modern education with India's vast intellectual traditions. Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) are urged to actively engage with these centers to strengthen research, curriculum innovation, and pedagogy in IKS.

The details for incorporation of Indian Knowledge System is given in **Annexure 45.3**

d) UGC letter F.No.1-3/2021(QIP) dated 23rd April 2025 specifies the details on UGC notification dated. 26th March 2025 - UGC (Minimum Standards of Instruction for the Grant of Undergraduate Degree and Postgraduate Degree) Regulations, 2025. (The Gazette of India 2nd April 2025, No.271)

The Salient points to be considered **for adoption & implementation of UGC's Minimum Standards** for the Grant of Undergraduate and Postgraduate Degrees and Examination and Evaluation process are given in **Annexure 45.4**

e) UGC in its letter F.No.1-2/2023(IC) dated 9th May 2025, has given the Guidelines for Admission and Supernumerary seats of International Students in Undergraduate and Postgraduate Programmes in Higher Educational Institutions in India.

Internationalisation of higher education is an essential aspect of the National Education Policy 2020. Internationalisation of higher education is the process of integrating an international and intercultural dimension in higher education. Opportunities to attract international students, academics and funding are growing and many Indian Higher Educational institutions (HEIs) are now committed to increase their international outreach. In order to facilitate the internationalisation of Indian HEIs, **the University Grants Commission has framed the guidelines for admission and creation of supernumerary seats for international students.**

Objectives

- 1. To facilitate a smooth and simple admission of international students in higher educational institutions of India.**
- 2. To create a favourable environment for attracting international students to Indian higher education system.**
- 3. To make India a preferred destination for international students.**

The Guidelines **to be adopted and implemented** for admission and creation of Supernumerary Seats for International Students are given in **Annexure 45.5**
